Where: Phoenix Flyers of Launceston located on Panshanger Road.

Cost: \$5 for ASAA financial members and **\$10** for non-financial members.

Lunch and canteen facilities will also be available on the day.

On the day we will be flying three rounds, each round will consist of flying the same sequence twice (both into the wind). Basic will fly three rounds of their known sequence. Categories sportsman and up will fly two known rounds and one unknown.

Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each category entered. Categories include Basic, Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced and Unlimited.

How do I enter the competition?

This part is simple, firstly you need to do is become a member of the Australian Scale Aerobatics Association (ASAA) database. If you're already a member please skip to point No4. There is NO fees associated with becoming a member; however, if you wish to become a financial member of the ASAA it will cost you \$37.50/ year and this will give you access to the full website plus discounted competition entry fees.

- 3. From here you will be issued with a log on and an ASAA number.
- 4. Log in using your new username and password, go to the "Events" section and find the appropriate competition (Tassie IMAC).
- 5. From here you will be able to entre yourself into the competition.
